

Adrian and Parma Share Spotlight; To Clash Friday

Behind the running and passing of Tim Tallman and Pud Franks, the Adrian Antelopes defeated Middleton 15-12 last Friday evening on the Oregon gridiron.

Adrian coaches report it was a good defensive game with Antelope Franks reaching the end zone on a five-yard run in the first quarter and Tallman scoring from 25 yards out in the third period.

Middleton's touchdowns came in the third and fourth quarters. Members of the Antelope coaching staff state they were pleased with defensive plays by Burdette Pratt, Bill Skogan and Dan Cutler.

Statistically, Middleton gained 160 yards rushing, compared to 210 for Adrian. The Idaho squad out-passed the Antelopes by 60 yards as they tallied 140 yards via the aerial route in comparison to 80 for the host team.

Adrian shares the spotlight with Parma as both have 3-0 records in league play. The big game comes this Friday night when the Antelopes travel to Parma to determine which will remain at the top in the northern division SRV-B league.

Enterprise Defeats Nyssa in 7-A2 Game; Vale Contest Slated

The Enterprise Savages invaded Nyssa territory Friday evening and defeated the host team 32-13 in a district 7-A2 grid battle.

Pat Savage scored both Bulldog touchdowns on runs of 19 yards in the first quarter and one yard in the second stanza. Billy Kouns kicked the extra point, making the halftime score 19-13 in favor of Enterprise.

The Savages scored a touchdown in each of the two final quarters, while the Bulldogs were unable to reach the end zone.

Nyssa will play Vale Friday evening for the district title and a win for the Vikings will give them the playoff berth.

Parents of participants and area residents are welcome to attend.

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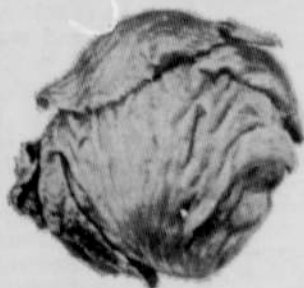
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
