Nyssa's Future Homemakers of America traveled to La Grande Saturday, Oct. 8, to participate in the annual Eastern Oregon District Leadership Conference.

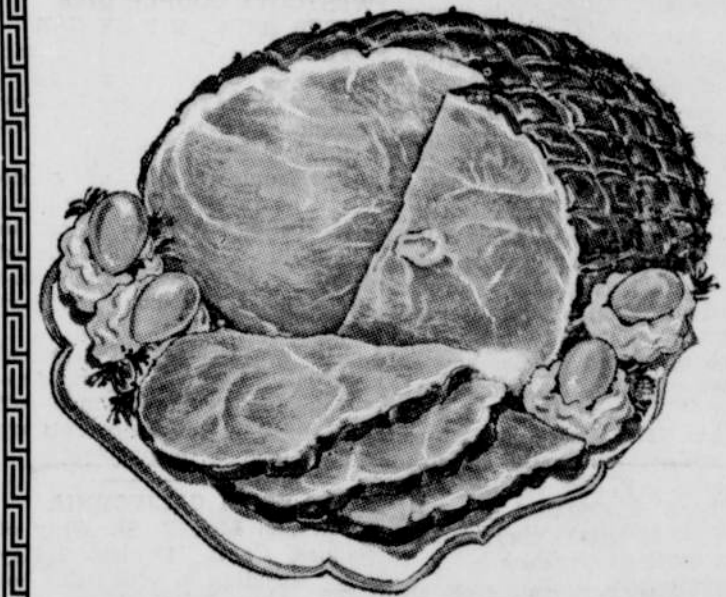
