According to a Navy news release, Electronics Technician Jack E. Dail, USN, is serving aboard the landing ship dock Colonial, which has returned to San Diego, Calif., from an eight-month deployment in the western Pacific. Homeported at San Diego, the Colonial participated in maneuvers in Vietnamese waters as a unit of the Seventh Fleet Amphibious Force.

During the cruise, landing exercises were conducted at Chin Bay, Okinawa, with a Marine battalion landing team embarked in the Colonial and two other ships.

When not in Vietnamese coastal waters, the Colonial visited such ports as Subic Bay, Philippines; Apra Harbor, Guam; Hong Kong, British Crown Colony; Sasebo and Yokosuka, Japan.
