Ellis White believes that the court, all road assessment district members, road supervisors and members of road crews are striving to maintain, improve roads and bridges, and oil quality roads in the most economical manner.

Approximately 120 miles of roads have been oiled in Malheur County during the past six years, establishing an all-time high in road improvement. Quality oiled roads cost money and no one man has the know-how or a magic formula to grade, base and oil roads at substantially lower cost than the county or any other road district.
