MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE MALHEUR COUNTY COURT—SEPTEMBER 14, 1966

The meeting called to order by Judge Ellis A. White with County Commissioners Jacob Fischer and Earl Flock present.

Adopted the Resolution to agree to work with the State of Oregon Board of Control Directional Detention in the work release and job replacement program for county prisoners under the direction of the County Sheriff.
