Strom Participates In Anti-Submarine Warfare Exercises

Yeoman Seaman Jerry D. Strom is serving aboard the guided missile frigate USS Leahy, now conducting anti-submarine warfare exercises in South American coastal waters, according to a Navy release.

He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Archie Strom of route 1, Nyssa.

The Leahy has left Punta Arenas, Chile—the southernmost city in the world—and will be passing through the Straits of Magellan. The strait is a 70-mile passage between the South American mainland and the Tierra Del Fuego Islands, and bypasses the treacherous Cape Horn waters at the tip of South America.

The training exercises will end in December after four months with anti-submarine forces of seven South American maritime nations including Colombia, Peru, Ecuador, Chile, Uruguay, Brazil and Venezuela.
