## Church Group Begins World Service Drive

Seventh-Day Adventists of the Parma area began their annual world service appeal Monday in Nyssa. Volunteers from the local congregation will continue to visit business firms during the next three weeks.

Solicited funds will be used to extend medical, welfare and educational services to 189 countries throughout the world, including the United States.

On a world-wide basis last year, the church aided over 10 million persons, distributed nearly 11 million articles of clothing, donated 11 million volunteer hours and contributed \$12 million in cash and food, according to information furnished by Ethel M. Doersch.
