New books going into circulation Saturday, Nov. 26, at Malheur county library in Ontario include the following.

"The Will to Win" by Jane McIlvaine. The story of Tommy Smith and Jay Trump who triumphed against odds to make history by winning the world's toughest steeplechase.

"The Titanic and the Californian" by Peter Padfield. The Titanic disaster and the truth about Captain Lord of the Californian who was blamed by two formal investigations for not going to the rescue.

"Conjectures of a Guilty By-stander" by Thomas Merton. A sequence of spontaneous notes, opinions, experiences, reflections and meditations.

"Test Ban and Disarmament" by Arthur H. Dean. The author expresses his personal views and analysis of the complex and interrelated problems of world disarmament and on the urgency and importance of curbing the arms race and preventing the spread of nuclear weapons.

"Chemistry in the Space Age" by Marjorie H. Gardner. A thorough, lucid treatment of basic chemistry and its importance to man's exploration of space.

"The Mathematics of Space Exploration" by Myrl H. Ahrendt. A study of celestial mechanics and the mathematics involved in space exploration.

"The Physics of Space" by Richard M. Sutton. To clarify the basic principles of space flight and elementary astronomy, the author presents the fundamental physics of space.

"Age of Exploration" by John R. Hale. The author relates and analyzes the story of the discoverers in clear, un sentimental prose.

"Boot Hill" by Lambert Florin. An account of historic graves of the Old West including that of Mrs. S. Chambers located near Beulah, Ore.

"Antiques You Can Decorate With" by George Grotz. A practical guide to what they are, where to find them and how much to pay for them.

"Christmas Treasures" by the Hallmark company. A collection of Christmas art and writing.

"The Road Past Altamont" by Gabrielle Roy. Four stages in the life of a young French-Canadian girl named Christine.

"Tree Frog" by Martin Woodhouse. A novel of adventure and suspense that combines science and aviation.

"Wild Horizon" by Van Wyck Mason. An exciting story of the American Revolutionary War.

"The Seasons Hereafter" by Elisabeth Ogilvie. The story of a woman who is married, but waiting for her day of liberation, who falls in love with a son of the autocratic family that employs her husband and owns the Maine island on which she lives.

"The Nevermore Affair" by Kate Wilhelm. A fast-moving novel about a group of research scientists kidnapped and illegally taken to a remote valley in the Rocky Mountains to work on the strange and mysterious Nevermore Project—a project which will ultimately bring immortality to the world.

"The Bright Young Man" by Mike Cohen. A novel about a young businessman.

"Modern Masterpieces of Science Fiction," edited by Sam Moskowitz. A distinguished anthology of 20th century science fiction.

"The Ground Is Our Table" by Steve Allen. The story of the migrant farm worker.

"Death of the Sweet Waters" by Donald E. Carr. An expert discussion of water and what we have done to destroy our streams and rivers, beaches and lakes, and how, perhaps, we can save ourselves from water starvation.

"The Jury Returns" by Louis Nizer. The author of "My Life in Court" is back with four new cases in which he once again fights valiantly for human rights under the law.

"Five Women I Love" by Bob Hope. The author's account of entertaining the troops in Vietnam.

"Vietnam, Yesterday and Today" by Ellen Hammer. The author traces the country's history and describes its geography and ethnic character.
