

Friday Loss, 51-50 Overtime Victory Begin Season for Bulldog Hoopsters

The Nyssa Bulldog hoopsters began their season at home with a Friday evening 37-30 loss to the Grant Union lads of John Day and a 51-50 victory on Saturday evening on the Enterprise court.

The Friday contest remained on an even keel throughout the first three quarters with no individual hoopster scoring many points.

Enterprise Lads Defeat Bulldogs In Mat Contest

The Nyssa matmen, champions last year, felt the pangs of loss Saturday evening when they bowed to the hosting Enterprise squad.

As reported by Coach Mel Calhoun, the final tally was 28-26.

Winning their matches by pins were Bob Peterson, 98 pounds; Ralph Estrada, 130; and Rudy Vendrell, 136. Losing by pins were Alan Cleaver, 106 pounds; and Rodney Blaylock, 178.

Fred Esplin, 157 pounds; Terry Pierce, 150; and Mike Terry, 123, won their matches by decision. Frank Rambaud, 148; and Jim Ableman, 168, lost by decision.

Don Marostica's match, in the 141-pound class, ended with a draw and heavyweight bouts were forfeited to the hosts.

Then in the final period, Grant Union broke open a close defensive struggle to capture the seven-point win.

Hagen led the John Day scorers with 11 points and Brad Maxfield topped the Bulldog crew with nine counters. Other Nyssa points were made by Tom Moore, 7; Scott Jefferies, 6; Dick Finger, 5; and Danny Wilson, 3.

Moore sank the deciding free throw in overtime play Saturday at Enterprise to win the Greater Oregon league thriller.

The Enterprise lads led the scoring at the end of each of the first three stanzas, but the Bulldogs retaliated and the game was tied 48-48 at the end of regulation play.

McGraw led the Enterprise scorers with 12 counters and with 15 points, Finger was Nyssa's top man.

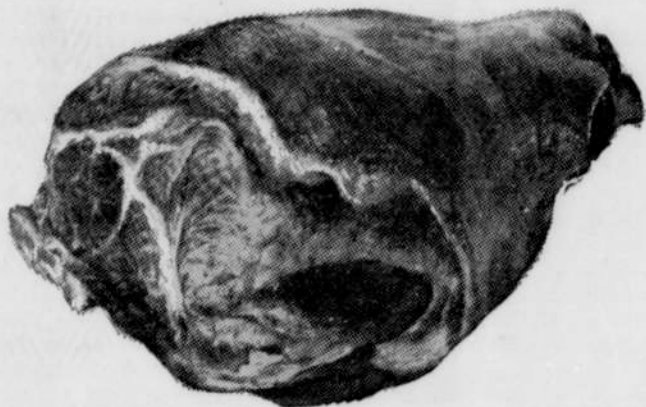
