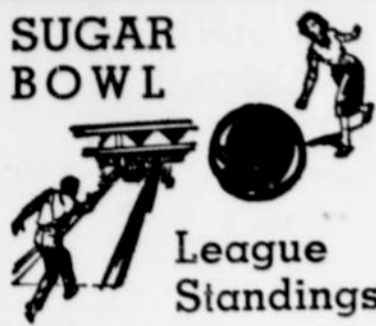

And in Arkansas, four juveniles faced no driving until further notice, a 10 p.m. curfew, orders to return to court in a month with letters from school principals reporting on grades and attitudes, full restitution of all damages and were forced to wear signs reading, "I have learned to respect property of others." An experience of being caught violating the laws governing misuse or damaging mail boxes, and having to appear before a judge who can hand out the various penalties, generally is enough to discourage any further violations. But to heed a warning is a lot less costly and humiliating, Dail concluded.
