Adrian's Ben Conklin, as on previous occasions, was again one of the top scoring men, but this time shared honors with Panther Skip Smyser as each chalked up 16 points. They were followed closely by Parma's Russ Klahr with 15 counters.

Other Antelopes scores were made by Tim Holly and Alan Zikmund, 10 each; Tim Tallman, 9; Don Beebe, 5; Atagi, 3; Franks and Sloan, 2 each.

Conklin took high scoring honors during the Saturday evening home game by putting 25 markers through the ring. Holly tossed in 14 and Tallman accounted for 10 points.

One upset was noted Saturday evening as Parma Panther Marc Mason lost by decision to Roger Thomas of Caldwell. This was the 130-pound wrestler's first defeat of the season.

A Journal reporter learned prior to press time that Marc was admitted to Malheur Memorial hospital and underwent an appendectomy Monday. He is reported by hospital authorities to be recovering nicely and will probably be released Thursday afternoon.

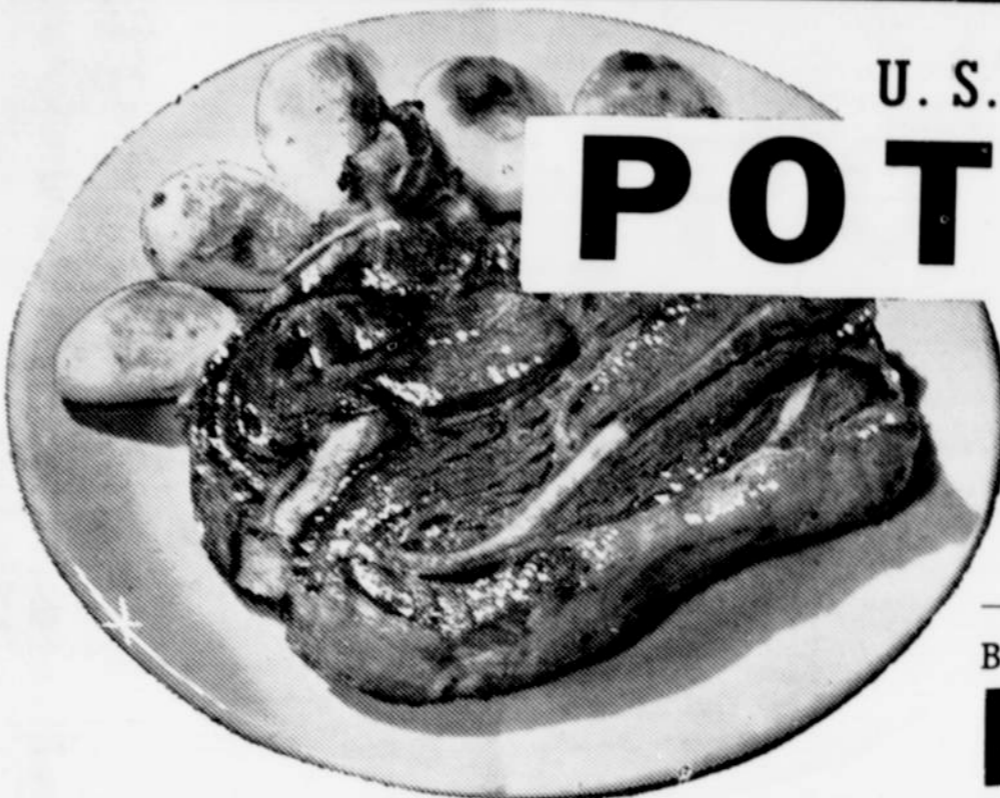
