### Tommy Ogura Rites To Be Held Today At Ontario Church

Funeral rites for Tommy (Tamito) Ogura will be conducted at 2 p.m. this afternoon, Feb. 23, 1967, at Community Methodist church in Ontario, with the Rev. George Uyemura officiating.

Mr. Ogura, former manager of the Sugar Bowl in Nyssa, succumbed Sunday at Holy Rosary hospital in Ontario after suffering a sudden heart attack while participating in a tournament at Gayway Bowl.

He was a lifetime resident of Oregon, having been born July 4, 1916 in Portland. He lived for two years at Vale before moving to the Ontario area 22 years ago.

On April 7, 1940, he was married to Toshiko Tsugawa in Salem. He had farmed, operated a radio shop and after leaving the Bye Lanes bowling establishment in Ontario where he was employed at time of his death.

The deceased was a member of the Community Methodist church and Japanese American Citizens league.

In addition to his widow, he is survived by four daughters, Mrs. Rodney (Patsy) Eden of Ontario, Linda Ogura of San Francisco, Marianne and Debbie Ogura of the home.

Other survivors include his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ogura of Ontario; one brother, Henry Ogura of Yakima, Wash.; three sisters, Mrs. Minnie Ito of New York City, Mrs. Sumi Oshiro of West Covina, Calif., and Mrs. Esther Semba of Carmichael, Calif.

Interment will be made in Evergreen cemetery at Ontario, under direction of Bertelson-Lienkaemper chapel.

### Kansas Rites Held For J. D. Reardon

The body of J. D. Reardon, who succumbed Monday, Feb. 13, 1967, at Malheur Memorial hospital, was shipped to Coffeyville, Kan., for services and burial, according to information secured from the office of his attorney at Ontario.

Mr. Reardon, a 75-year-old bachelor, was found Feb. 9 by a neighbor and was lying ill on the floor of his home at 207 Park avenue. He was taken to the hospital by a member of the Nyssa police department who was notified immediately.

The deceased had farmed in the area, prior to his retirement and move into Nyssa. According to records in the Journal office, he became a subscriber to the local paper on July 8, 1952, and at that time resided on route 2, Nyssa.

He is survived by one brother, Granville Reardon of Coffeyville; two sisters, Beatrice Allen of Thayer, Kan., and Ruth Reeves of East Chicago, Ind. Three nephews also survive.
