EASTER RELIGIOUS SERVICES

METHODIST CHURCH

Two worship services will be held on Easter Sunday at Nyssa Methodist Church. The first will be at 8:30 a.m. and the second at 11 o'clock. Church school will convene at 9:45 on Easter Sunday only. Regular hour is 9:30 a.m.

"The Gospel According to Charlie Brown," will be title of a sermon to be delivered by the Rev. Ralph A. Lawrence during both of the Easter services.

Funeral services for William B. Toomb will be conducted at 2 o'clock this afternoon, March 23, 1967 at Lienkaemper chapel. Officiating will be the Rev. Orville Jacobson of Faith Lutheran church.

Mr. Toomb succumbed Monday at Holy Rosary hospital in Ontario, following a series of heart attacks.

He was born April 22, 1906 in Stephen, Minn., and moved with his parents to the Nyssa-Adrian area when he was six months old.

The deceased attended Nyssa schools and on Jan. 1, 1926 was married to Bernice Martin at the home of her parents in Kingman Colony.

Mr. Toomb was a member of Kingman Colony grange and Nyssa Faith Lutheran church, an honorary member of the Adrian high school FFA chapter and past president of the Malheur county Jersey Cattle club.

In addition to his widow of the home, he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Vincent (Dorothy) Scott of Culdesac, Idaho and Mrs. James (Betty) Hess of Ontario.
