### Nellie Rose Powell Winifred Seaward

Mass services for Nellie Rose (Morris) Powell will be conducted at 10 o'clock this morning, May 18, 1967, at St. Bridget's Catholic church. Officiating will be Father Cletus M. Kirkpatrick. Recitation of the Rosary was Wednesday evening at Lienkaemper chapel.

Mrs. Powell, a 44-year resident of Nyssa succumbed Monday at Malheur Memorial hospital following a recent heart attack.

She was born Sept. 16, 1892 in Montana and was married in September 1923 to Eddie J. Powell. He succumbed July 22, 1956.

In 1924 Mr. Powell built the Powell service station building at Second and Main streets. That building recently was sold by Mrs. Powell to several Nyssa merchants. It has been razed and that space is now one of Nyssa's Thunderegg parking malls, adjacent to Bracken's department store.

At one time, "Eddie's Cabin" at Prairie City was a rendezvous for Mr. and Mrs. Powell and their many friends who liked the outdoors. Almost every fall, the cabin was base headquarters for many Nyssa hunters.

Mrs. Powell was a member of St. Bridget's church.

She is survived by one brother, Leo F. Morris of Seattle; two sisters, Mrs. Anna R. Kolbe of Los Angeles and Mrs. Thoe (Mary) Moore of Ontario.

Among surviving nephews and nieces are Bill Moor of Vale; Evelyn Towne Johansen of Beaverton, Ore.; and Colleen Towne Barry of Salt Lake City. In addition to Mr. Powell, she was preceded in death by her parents; one brother, Thomas Moore, Portland; and a sister, Elsie Towne, Nyssa.

Interment will be made in St. John's cemetery at Ontario, under direction of Lienkaemper chapel. Active pallbearers will be Aden Wilson, Joseph Maughan, William Van Zelf, William Wahlert, William Schireman and Charles J. Smith.

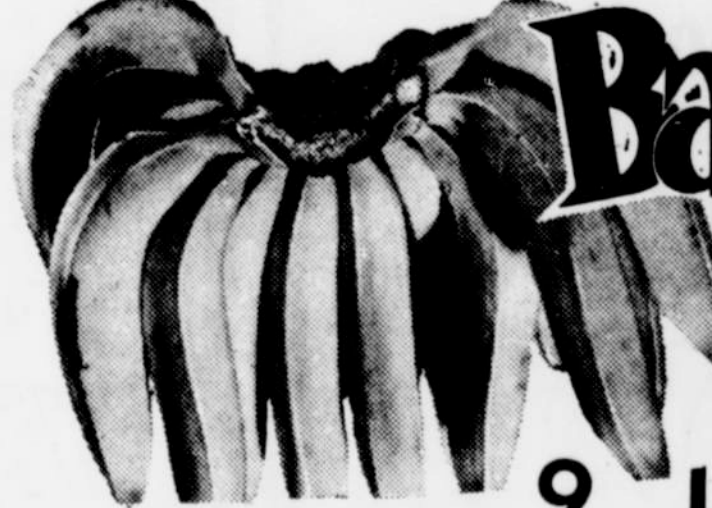
