Hells Canyon Shuttle-Bus Service Ends

Idaho Power Company, reporting that the spring run of steelhead in the Snake River "apparently is over," announced Wednesday that it has discontinued weekend shuttle-bus service to fishing grounds below the Hells Canyon Dam project.

H. R. Moore, vice-president for power production, said the end of the steelhead run was indicated by "disappointing" catches and the small number of migrants being handled by the utility's temporary collection facility at Hells Canyon.

Idaho Power began the shuttle service on Saturdays and Sundays with the start of the run early in March.

Special buses transported fishermen some nine miles downstream from a gate at Big Bar to the Oregon side of the river below the utility's project.

The gate was installed by the project general contractor because of limited working space at the dam site and the large construction vehicles traveling the access highway downstream.

Moore pointed out that the public will have safe and easy access to the area for fishing and other purposes with the project's completion in 1968.

The next stop was near a canyon that took off to the right. The students split up into groups and started up the canyon in search of specimens. In the canyon there were mining shafts, where quartz was found. We also found rhyolites, geodes, manganize, denrites and lime rock.

At 1 p.m. we left the canyon, and went to the picnic grounds where we ate lunch and looked for more specimens.

While getting ready to leave the picnic grounds a hail storm hit and we decided not to go to the thunderegg bed. Instead we went to a fossil bed where fossils of leaves and ferns were found.

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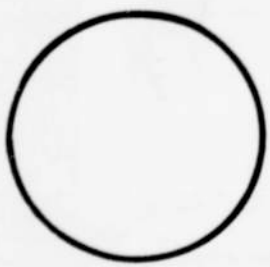
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
