Next meeting will be June 13 at the Moore hotel, with Dr. Sam Probanz as guest speaker.

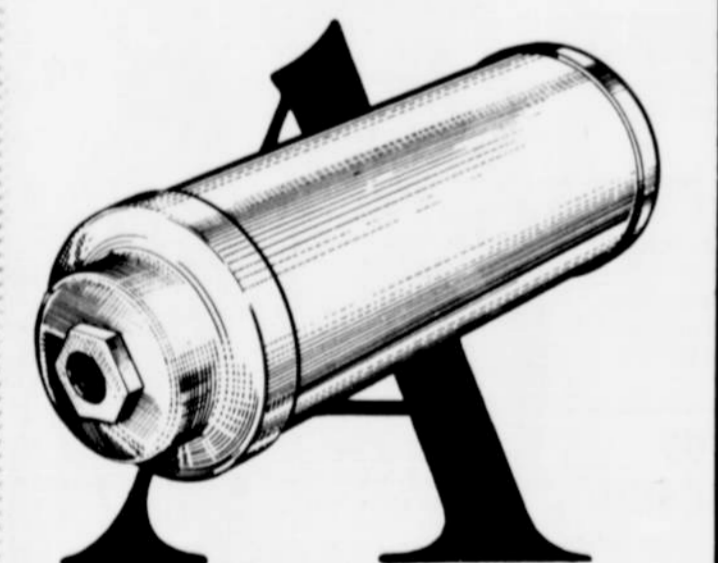
