**THIS IS PROGRESS** -- The picture above was furnished by Bob Thompson and was taken from his file of 'old-time' Nyssa photographs. According to Art Boydell, the structure was built in 1918 by Nyssa Trading Company, owned by himself and Bob's father, Jess Thompson. They used it for storage and sold it to Eder Hardware company in 1923 when Boydell became part owner and manager of that firm. Having now served its purpose, the building is being razed. Exact information as to who now owns the property has been hard to come by, but it is believed that Union Pacific Railroad company owns the plot -- the building has been leased to Eder's and the ground space to Muir Roberts company. Future plans for the plot are apparently indefinite.

Ident of the Ontario Chamber of Commerce, representing the civic groups of the area.

Others in attendance will be Highway Commissioners David B. Simpson and Fred W. Hill, State Highway Engineer Forrest Cooper, and other Highway Department officials. Among others expected to attend are members of the State Legislature, members of the State Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee, and city and county officials from the area.

In northeastern Oregon, including Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Baker, and Malheur Counties, the State now has 18 parks, waysides, and recreation areas. These total approximately 8,459 acres. Attendance at the site totaled 1,156,290 in 1960, with day users accounting for 1,049,876 and overnight campers for the other 106,414.
