FRANCISCO FLORES (Killed in Action)

Final rites for Cpl. Francisco J. Flores were conducted Monday afternoon, June 5, 1967 at Peckham-Dakan chapel in Parma. Officiating was the Rev. Lupe Juarez of the Nyssa Latin Assembly of God, with military rites held at the Parma cemetery.

The 21-year-old former Nyssan was killed May 21 while on active duty in Vietnam.

Cpl. Flores was born Sept. 12, 1945 in Great Falls, Mont., a son of Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas Flores who now reside on route 3, Parma. The deceased moved with his parents in 1950 to Nyssa. He was a member of St. Bridget's Catholic church in Nyssa.

He attended the local schools and in December 1965 joined the Marine Corps. He was a platoon squad leader, and it has been reported, that prior to his death, he had been wounded twice in action.

In addition to his parents, he is survived by a brother, Matt Flores and three sisters, Lillie Montoya, Linda Sayas and Cornelia Flores, all of Parma. Also surviving is a grandmother, Mrs. Mary Torres of Greenfield, Calif.

PANFILO RIOS recently received his discharge from the Armed Forces and returned home Friday from Grafton, Ill. Specialist Fifth Class Rios is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Bill Rios of Nyssa and holds a 'good conduct' medal. While in the service he was a military policeman and received an expert rating with the carbine rifle and '45' pistol. At the present time, he has not decided on his plans for the future.
