Greg Duff, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. M. Duff of Nyssa and a 1963 graduate of Nyssa High school recently signed a National Football League agreement to play with the Chicago Bears.

He is to report to rookie camp June 11 along with 30 other rookies.

Greg played two years of football at Nyssa with Bob Morford as coach. He then attended Boise (Id.) college for two years.

In the Spring of 1965 he transferred to Idaho State university in Pocatello, on a full tuition scholarship.

He is married to the former Kathy Caskey of Boise and has a one and one half year old daughter, Kelly.

Greg plans to be a high school coach and teacher after a career in professional football.

House Okays Public Lands Interim Group

Representative Robert F. Smith (R-Burns) stated recently that the Oregon House of Representatives has passed HJR 50 which creates an Interim Committee on Public Lands to serve during the next biennium. The Resolution provides for the appointment of three Senators and four Representatives to compose the committee, which is directed to continue its study of the role of the State of Oregon in the acquisition, sale, exchange, ownership, and management of Public Lands. The Resolution asks the Interim Committee to devote particular attention to present and future needs of water in the development of the Public Lands of Oregon, and to the jurisdiction of the state over submersible and submerged lands.

Representative Smith, who chaired the Interim Committee on Public Lands during the last biennium, told the members of the House that there is a particular need for continuing the activities of the Interim Committee over the next two years because of the important studies being conducted by the Congressional Public Land Law Review Commission. Smith, who is currently Oregon's representative on the Commission, stated that the Commission is conducting studies of such important matters as water diversion and the allowable harvest of timber which are of vital importance to the economy of Oregon. "The Commission will submit its final report to Congress by the end of this year," Smith stated, "and Oregon needs continued activity by the Interim Committee on Public Lands to be sure that our state's interests are adequately protected in the Commission's report."
