### License Dealers Now Have Fall Hunting Rules

Although the big game regulations booklet will not be available to hunters for at least three week or more, information on the fall hunts is available at all license dealers.  
 License agencies have been provided with a summary of the regulations which includes season dates, bag limits, and a brief on the open areas for all big game seasons scheduled for this fall. Big game seasons listed in the summary include general deer and elk hunts, unit permit hunts, extended seasons, and controlled seasons. A listing of archery seasons is also included, along with the bear and mountain goat seasons.  
 Hunters interested in filing application for the controlled hunts or unit permit hunts are requested to contact their local license dealer. Hunting licenses and big game tags may also be obtained.  
 The regulations booklet is expected to be available for distribution to hunters by late June or early July.
