... Serves as Group Commander

Nyssa Attorney Gene Stunz assumed duties as Group Commander of the Naval Reserve Group Command at the Boise, Idaho Naval Reserve Training Center, following his installation Monday evening in the center's quarter-deck area in the Idaho capital city.

The new Commander replaces Boiesan W. W. Benson whose tour ends July 1 this year.

Commander Stunz joined the Naval Reserves in December, 1943 and the Navy sent him to college under the Officer Training Program, and later the NROTC at the University of Washington in Seattle and Willamette university in Salem.

He was commissioned in June, 1946, upon graduation from NROTC. He was on active duty during the Korean conflict for two years (1951-1953). At that time he was a Lieutenant and served as navigator of AKA (Amphibious Cargo Transport).

Stunz then became associated with Naval Reserve Surface Divisions at Boise and Salem.

He was graduated from law school in 1959 and began his practice in Nyssa during late summer that year. Stunz was promoted to the rank of Commander in 1962, and served as Commanding Officer of the Boise Surface Division for three years, with his tour ending on July 1 last year.

The new Commander and his staff will oversee the training of all Naval Reserve units in Southwest Idaho.
