Malheur county livestock operators have met all necessary requirements for a certified brucellosis free status according to word received at the county agent's office from DVM E. L. Henkel, supervisor of disease control for the Oregon State Department of Agriculture.

This culminates intensive testing and vaccination programs carried on by stockmen in the county for many years, according to George Bain, Malheur extension agent.
