State Dairy Princess Seeks National Title

Oregon Dairy Princess Alice Pitney of Junction City, the state's number one dairy representative, boarded a sleek jetliner at Portland's International airport on July 17 to wing her way to the finals of the American dairy princess contest in Chicago.

The 22-year-old princess will be bidding for the industry's highest honor, the title of American Dairy Princess. The national crown is currently worn by Carol Ann Armacost of Maryland.

Miss Pitney, having completed a year of activity as Oregon's dairy princess, traveled to the national finals with her chaperone, Mrs. Oscar Haag. They are in Chicago for four days.

Princess Alice's successor was named last month. It is a practice in Oregon that the newly-named dairy princess will serve as a roving ambassador for the Oregon Dairy Products commission for one year before she vies for the American title.

During this time, the new royalty visits all counties in the state and makes appearances before all types of audi-

ences on behalf of the Oregon dairy industry.

Beginning Monday evening Princess Alice and other contestants started a rigorous round of activities in Chicago.

A panel of judges are evaluating the performance of the dairy princesses and will select one to serve as America's dairy ambassador of good will for the next year.

As Oregon's princess for the past year, Miss Pitney traveled over 35,000 miles throughout the state "speaking up for milk" and for the dairy farmers of Oregon.

The grand finale of the American Dairy Princess contest is at noon today, July 20, in the Continental Plaza hotel. Selection of the American Dairy Princess and her alternate will be announced at the climax of the three-day period.
