### Bankers, Lending Agencies To Write FCIC Applications

Banks and other lending agencies in 75 counties in the United States will be writing federal crop insurance applications during the next three years for their farm borrowers.

J. Ford Anderson, district director for the Corporation, states this experiment has been started by the corporation in its continuing search for more practical and economical ways to expand its service to farmers.

If the results justify, this plan will be expanded to more counties and more lending agencies.

Anderson further states that success of this program is expected since many lenders are already making use of the collateral assignment feature of the federal crop insurance policy to protect farm loans. An insured borrower can assign any indemnity due under his policy as loan collateral. In the event of a crop loss, the indemnity check is paid jointly to the insured and the lender.

Realizing the need for greater protection, because of crop production costs becoming higher and higher, the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation

has, through its analysis and actuarial programs, been able to offer more protection to farmers in the United States. Much of this protection increase will be available in the Pacific Northwest states of Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

Farmers in the area not now covered with federal crop insurance protection are urged to visit their local FCIC agent and apply for this protection for the 1968 crop year.

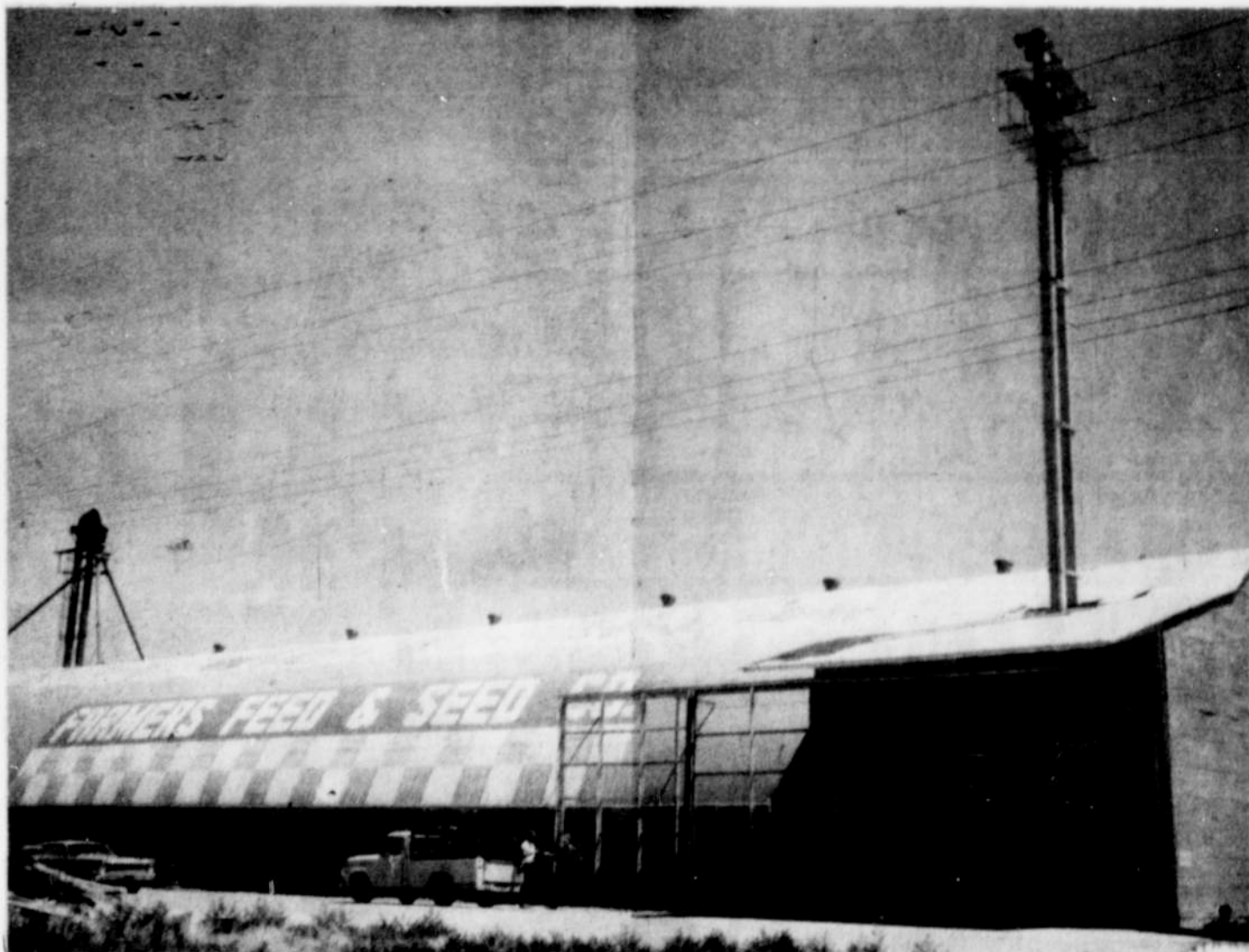
