Ontario Gets \$36,000 Grant For Airport

Senator Wayne Morse and Congressman Al Ullman were notified Friday that \$36,349 has been allocated by the Federal Aviation Agency for improvements at the Ontario Municipal airport.

The legislators said federal funds would be used to construct a partial parallel taxiway and to purchase land for a clear zone on runway 14-32.

The money is part of a \$1.2 million FAA program in Oregon for fiscal year 1968.

Ontario City Superintendent Lloyd Castner said the expansion was necessary because of increased airport activities prompted by Treasure Valley Community college's pilot training program. (Argus Observer.)

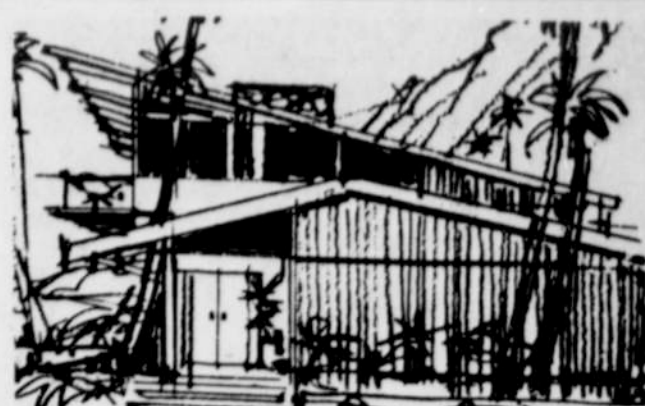

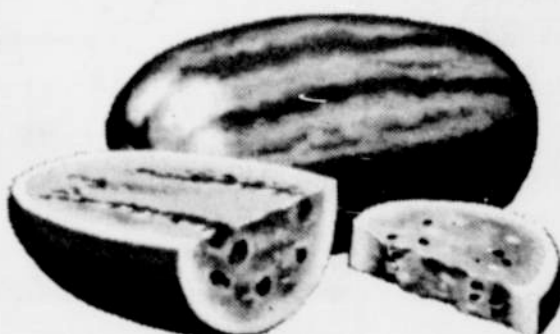

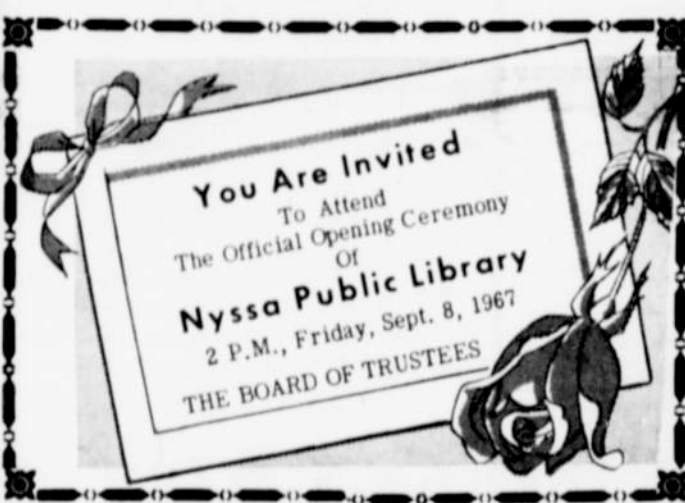
