Funeral services for Ivan Haney, 49, were conducted Wednesday afternoon, Nov. 15, 1967 at the Chapel of Flowers mortuary in North Ogden, Utah.

Mr. Haney succumbed of apparent heart failure on the previous Sunday in St. Benedict's hospital there.

He was born Sept. 5, 1918, in Lewiston, Utah, a son of Pierce M. and Lucy Payne Haney Sr. He grew up and was educated in the Dayton, Idaho and Ogden areas. He moved to Ogden in 1935.

The deceased was married to Karleen J. Little on Feb. 5, 1952 in Ogden. They were later divorced.

He had worked as a custodian at Weber State college for 12 years. Mr. Haney helped to organize the Melody Rangers, a western orchestra in the Ogden area from 1947 to 1957.

The deceased had formerly worked at the Clearfield Naval Supply depot.

During World War II, he served in the U. S. Army and was a former member of the Disabled Veterans organization and a member of the LDS church.

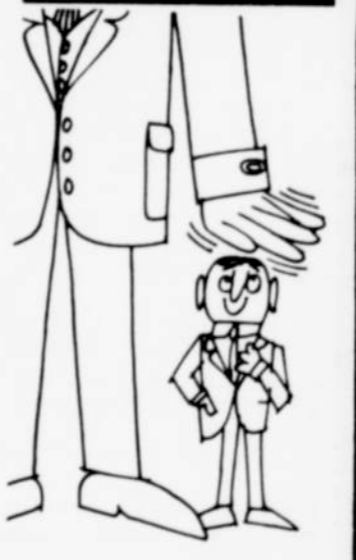

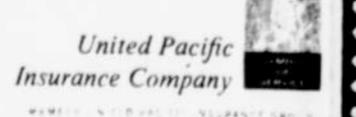
