COURSE ON SOILS, FERTILIZER SLATED FOR AREA PATRONS

A soils and fertilizer short course, designed to give farmers and other interested persons a better understanding of the role of fertilizer in crop production, will be held in Ontario starting November 29, according to Leeds Bailey, county extension agent.

The schedule calls for sessions on November 29 and 30; December 6, 7, 13, and 14. Classes will run from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. each day.
