"If you fail to plan you must plan to fail." This was a statement made in connection with the study of meal planning which the Home Ec II classes are currently studying.

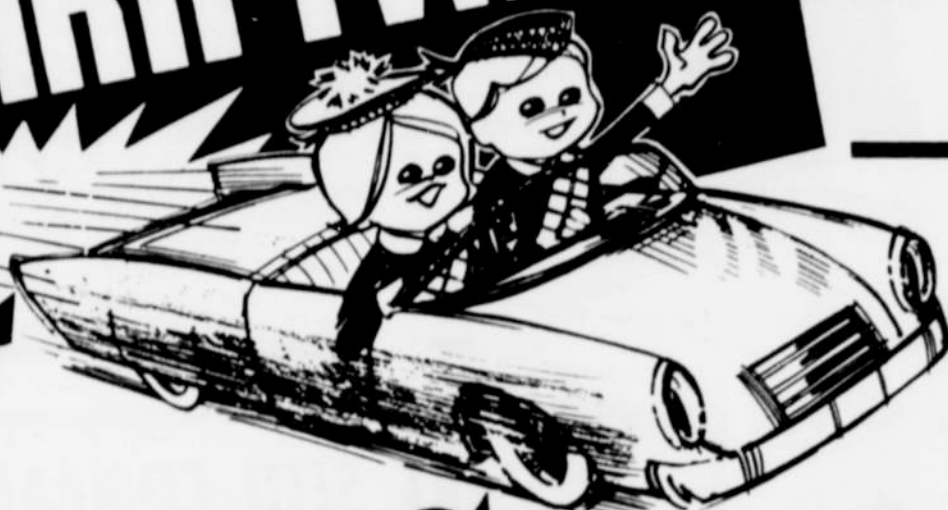

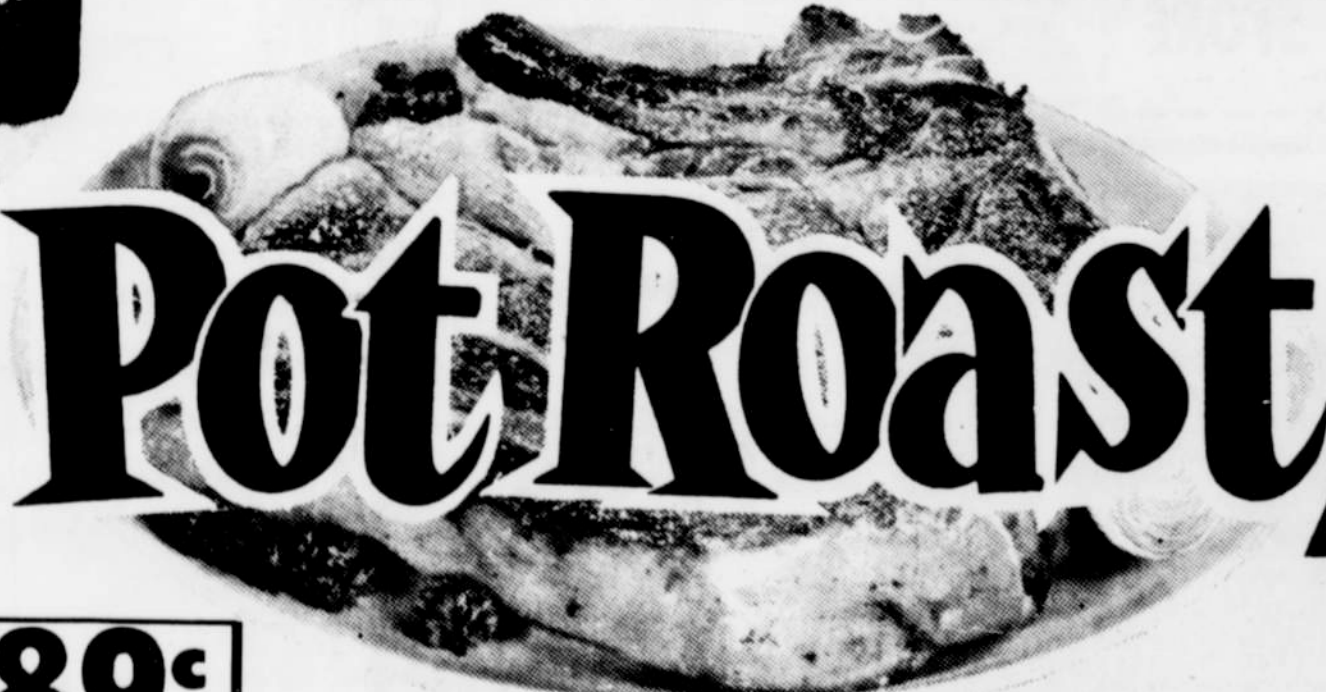
