ADULT NON-FICTION
HORSES, HITCHES AND ROCKY TRAILS by Joe Back. The wilderness is no place for a person who doesn't know what he is doing. Mr. Back tells in this informative book how to haul loads successfully in this country and not hurt our animals.
TOLSTOY by Henri Troyat. "Tolstoy fascinated people of his own time." In this complete works one may imagine that it is also a book Tolstoy himself might have written -- a final complete portrait of the man as he surely was.
ENCYCLOPEDIA OF U. S. GOVERNMENT BENEFITS, edited by Roy A. Grisham Jr., and Paul D. McConaughy. The first reference book ever published that presents in concise-to-use form, all services and resources available from the government.

WORLD AFLAME by Billy Graham. The heartfelt expression of the world-famous evangelist's concern over the world's despair.

ADULT NON-FICTION OREGON HISTORY
EPITAPH FOR THE GIANTS by J. Larry Kemp. This is the story of the Tillamook burn, one of America's greatest disasters.
THE OREGON STORY by Vivian Corbett Atterbury. "The Oregon Story" does not exactly follow any prototype but goes off on delightful original excursions of reporting and appreciation.
CATTLE COUNTRY OF PETER FRENCH by Giles French. Stripped of all the extravagant yarns that have grown up about this wild, beautiful land in the days of the cattle barons, this book shows that

the honest portrayal of these men of the old west is more readable, more challenging than any fiction about them.

PACIFIC GRAVEYARD by James A. Gibbs. You will read about captains who followed their ships into the deep, passengers facing for the first time the full terror of ship-wreck on stormy seas.
EARLY DAYS IN OLD OREGON by Katharine B. Judson. A new edition by an authoritative author, of this well-known book, long out of print.
PETER SKENE OGDEN; FUR TRADER by Archie Binns. Here is the first full-scale biography of this man--trader, trapper, explorer, diplomat, patriarch, and a Chief Factor of the Hudson's Bay Company at Fort Vancouver on the Columbia.

THE DOCTOR IN OREGON by O. Larsell. Activities of medical men in the Pacific Northwest constitute a story that parallels that of the fur trader in sheer force of action and colorful detail.
A LEAF FROM FRENCH EDDY by Ben Hur Lampman. Mr. Lampman has devoted a lifetime to, and wrote well of, fish, rivers and men.
JUSTICE IN THE BACK ROOM by Selwyn Raab. In this searching book it is explained why police fee they have to resort to questionable tactics in solving crimes. Raab examines ethics, legality, and justice. He points the way to better justice and suggests a solution that protects the police as well as the suspect.
NO MAN LIKE JOE by Harvey E. Tobie. Of the picturesque characters inhabiting early Oregon, none equaled Joe Meek in dramatic personality.

CANVAS CARAVANS by Eleanor Allen. Based upon a recently discovered diary of Esther McMillan Hanna. A story of the journey the Hannas took along the Oregon Trail to Oregon.
FIRST THREE WAGON TRAINS by John Bidwell. Hubert Howe Bancroft & James Longmire - Of these three wagon trains, one went all the way over the Oregon Trail, 1948 miles from Independence to Oregon City.
NARCISSA WHITMAN by Opal Sweazea Allen. Mrs. Whitman and Mrs. Spalding were the first white ladies to cross the rocky mountains. This is a first complete biography.
FABULOUS OPAL WHITELEY by Elbert Bede. A mystery which has lasted for a third of a century and which has caused endless guessing and speculation, is here presented in all its fascinating details.

SACAJAWEA OF THE SHOSHONES by Della Gould Emmons. Far Horizons is the motion picture title of this famous and beautiful story, Sacajawea

of the Shoshones. In this new edition are 16 pages of pictures from the screen version -- pictures that dramatically and hauntingly underscore memorable moments in the great Lewis and Clark Expedition.
