Nyssa Churches Sponsor Ecumenical Lenten Series

The Catholic, Christian, Episcopal, Lutheran and Methodist parishes of Nyssa will continue a series of Lenten films which began on the high school level last year.

A series of films has been selected for this year's discussions. A general film, "Religious Revolution and the Void" will begin the series, followed in the next three weeks by a three-part film study of Christianity. The final week's film is yet to be determined.

The films will be shown to high school students at 7:30 on Wednesday evenings and at the same hour on Thursday evenings to adult members of the parishes beginning the week of Ash Wednesday, Feb. 28. Each session will be held in the social hall of St. Bridget's Church at Fifth street and Locust Avenue. All adult patrons of the community are invited to the film showing - discussions on Thursday evenings.

There will be a charge of \$1 to help defray costs, payable at the door at the first session. The \$1 charge for the series will apply to one individual, but also covers all members of a participating family.
