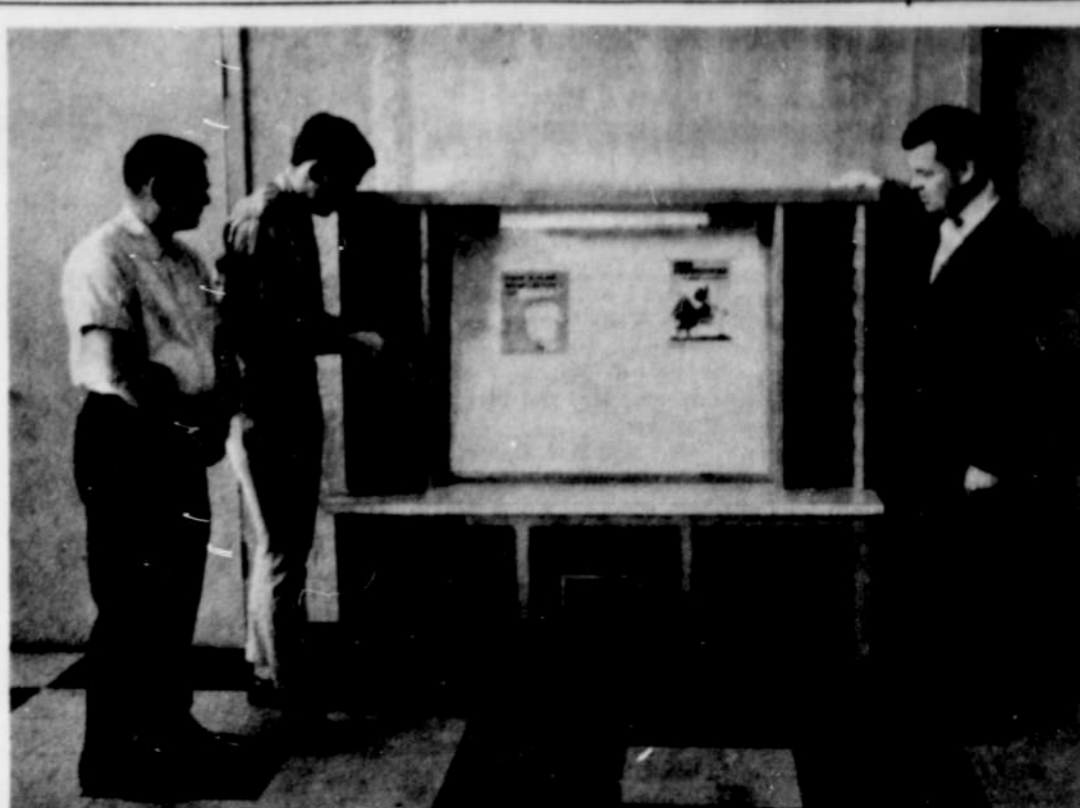

## College, Vocation, Scholarship (CVS) Unit To Aid NHS Students

An innovation of the guidance department is the portable college, vocational and scholarship center. For future reference, this portable student information center will be referred to as CVS.

Charles Quinowski, guidance director, stated that the obvious need for such an information center has been noted for some time, because of the fact that the guidance office and resource area are not in the general

traffic pattern of high school students. By the utilization of CVS, students will find certain kinds of information pertaining to college, vocations and scholarships more readily available to them. Guidance information presented through this means need not be checked out or returned.

The CVS center will also have other unique features. A bulletin board portion will be used to advertise monthly guidance events as well as job possibilities, scholarship bulletins and various kinds of useful information.

It is planned the CVS center will be lighted and wired for sound, which will be useful in advertising guidance events and other school activities. Quinowski has indicated that the CVS center was designed with interest of Nyssa high school students in mind. It is hoped that each student will accept a certain amount of responsibility for the upkeep and care of this student center.

Students are reminded that this is not designed as a handy place to stack books for a rest stop during the course of the day. Respect for the CVS center is necessary, and will be appreciated by the guidance department, Quinowski added.
