The Nyssa Woman's Bowling association formed a "600" Club Feb. 14, 1968 at the Sugar Bowl. The seven charter members present at this organiza-

tional meeting included Eris Bertram, Connie Bullard, Ailene Holmes, Bonnie Nichols, Lois Page, Phoebe Snyder, and Billie Wright. Other eligible

bowlers joining the club since that time are Mable Fangen and Ruth Chadd.

After six years, from the date the very first bowling ball was

officially rolled down the lanes of the Sugar Bowl on September 8, 1962, it was decided that there were now enough women who have attained that elusive '600' mark to form a club.

Officers elected are Lois Page, president; Connie Bullard, vice president; Phoebe Snyder, secretary; Ailene Holmes, sergeant-at-arms. Dues are to be 50¢ per year, and all members are to either make or buy a black vest and the official (Nyssa "600" Club) emblem will be attached to the back of each.

The women are to put all of their bowling emblems and pins they have won over the years on these vests, and to wear them during the Nyssa women's bowling association tournament.

There have been thirteen women roll 600's since the Sugar Bowl first opened, but all of them are not present members of the local association, which is one requirement to become a member of the newly formed club.

Eris Bertram was the first woman to roll a 600; Phoebe Snyder has the honor of rolling the highest series, a 635. Connie Bullard is the only one to have "nerves of steel" and under tournament pressure rolled her first 600. Ruth Chadd has the distinction of having rolled the latest 600 locally, a 602 on February 21, 1968.

As an added feature to the Nyssa women's city tournament to be held March 30-31, the "600" Club will award a prize to a member of their club rolling the highest scratch series in tournament competition.
