MERRY MIXERS

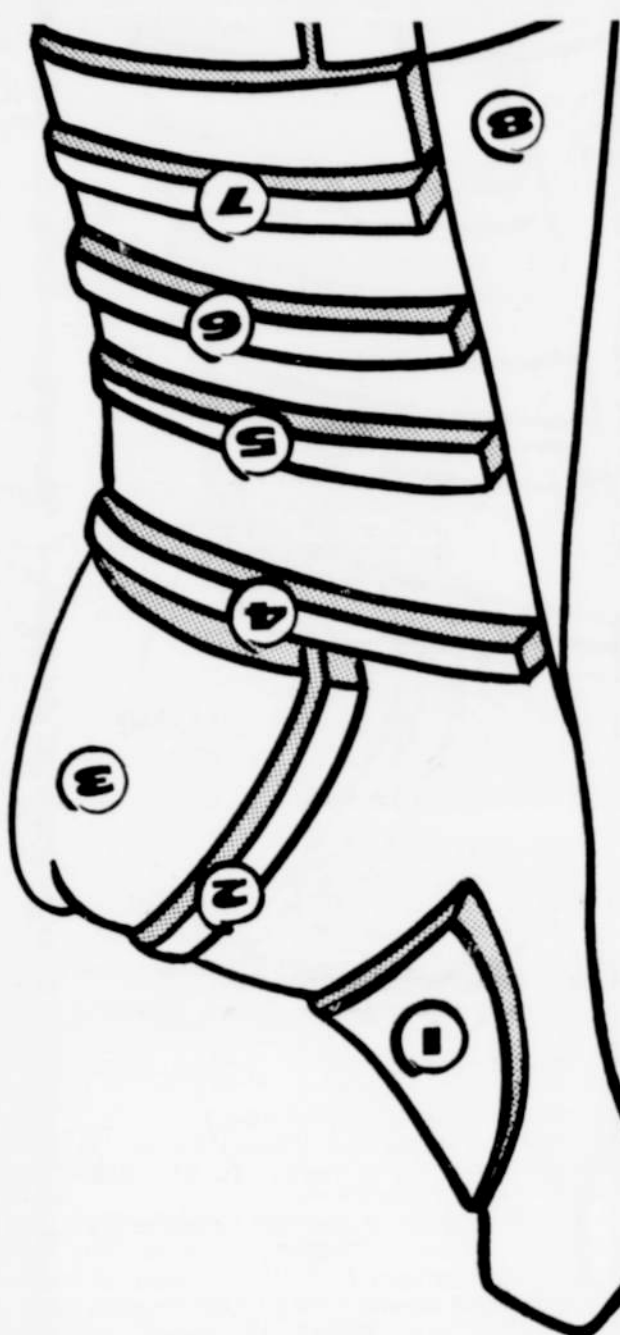
Nine 4-H members and our leaders took a field trip to two grocery stores during our April 9 meeting. We made a study of prices of different foods in these stores.
