OSU Scientists Prepare Basin Maps Of Oregon

General soil maps for potentially irrigable Oregon basins are being prepared by Oregon State University soil scientists in cooperation with the state Soil Conservation Service.

Dr. Gerald H. Simonson and Dr. Ellis G. Knox, OSU soils professors, explained that the maps are being done for the Oregon State Water Resources Board under a special grant.

It is extremely important to find out how much Oregon water will ultimately be needed to irrigate all irrigable Oregon land, Simonson pointed out.

The OSU soil scientists said they expect detailed reports of ultimate water needs for 16 Oregon basins to be published within two years.

Basins studied include: North Coast, Willamette (Upper, Middle, Lower and Sandy), Hood, Deschutes, John Day, Umatilla, Grand Ronde, Powder, Malheur, Owyhee, Malheur Lake area, Goose and Summer Lakes area, Klamath, Rogue, Umpqua, South and Mid Coast.

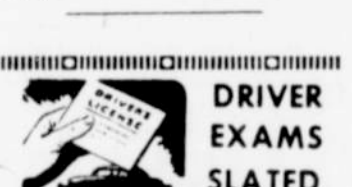

Persons wishing original licenses or permits to drive are asked to file applications well ahead of the scheduled closing hour in order to assure time for completion of the required license test.

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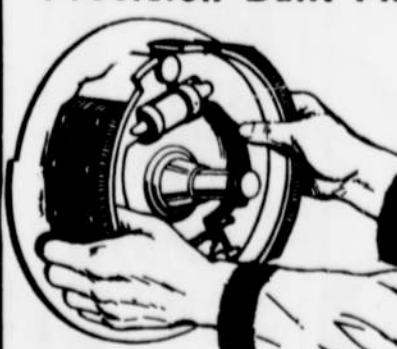

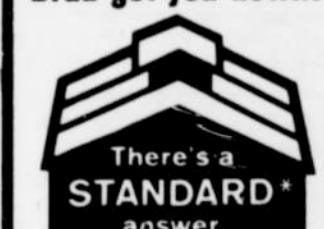
