Oregon statutes prohibit, among other things, the carrying of concealed weapons, on 3 Music Festival. They prohibit anyone, other than law enforcement officials, from possessing a machine gun without a license. State laws also prohibit the manufacture, sale and use of events brass knuckles, sling shots, sandbags, blackjacks, and other similar devices. Switch blades and automatic spring knives are also prohibited. State law prescribes severe penalties for the sale or giving of firearms or weapons and ammunition to minors under 18.




