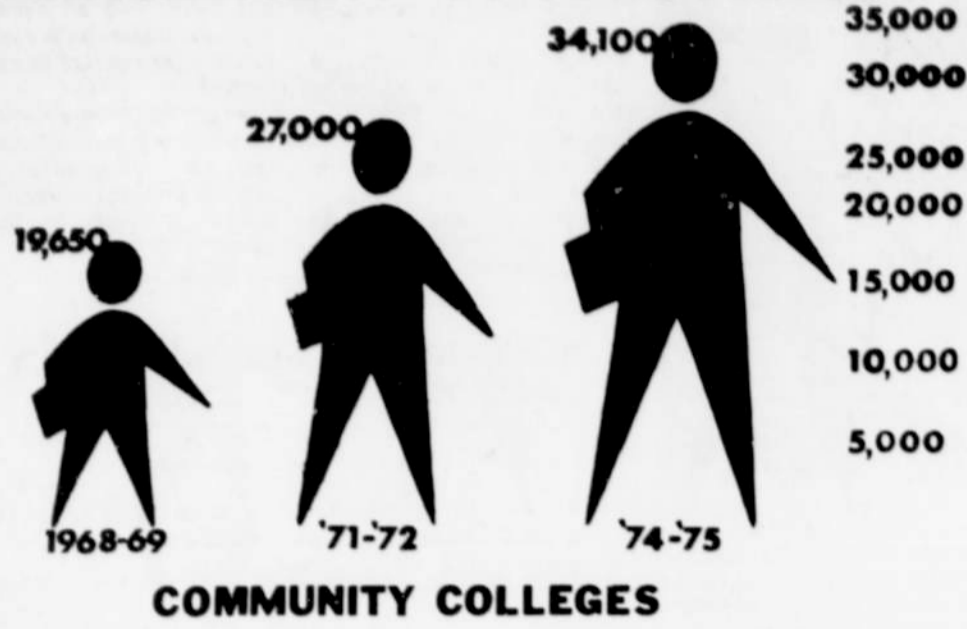
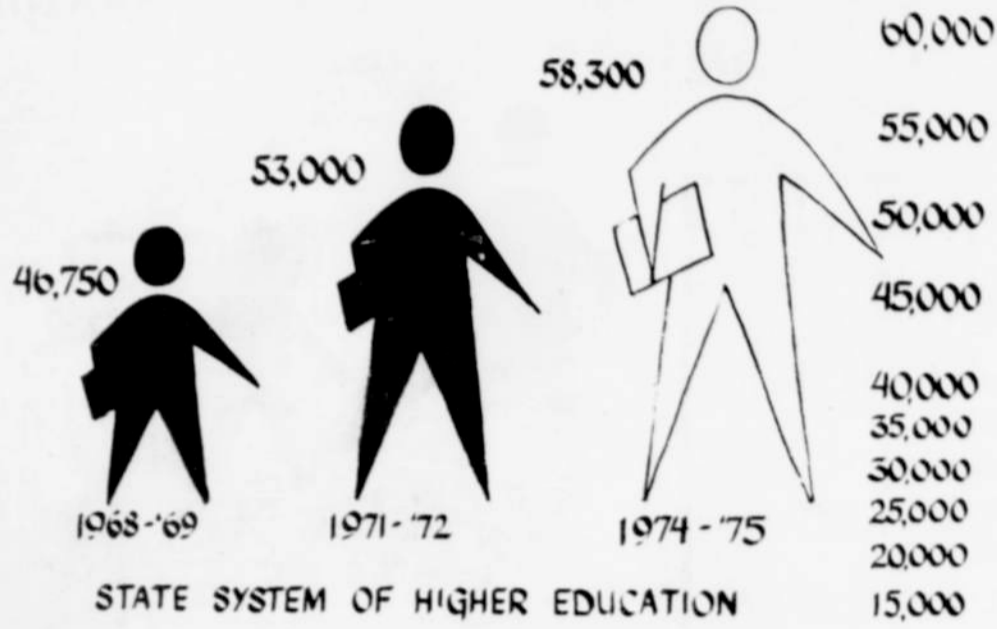

Eastern Oregon Ticks Cause Various Diseases

Wood ticks have emerged from hibernation in Eastern Oregon - in the lower elevations they were collected in early March of this year. Ticks are most prevalent in Eastern Oregon from March to June. Dermacentor andersoni, the Rocky Mountain wood tick, is the most commonly found hard tick in Eastern Oregon and has proven to be the vector for Rocky Mountain spotted fever, Colorado tick fever, tick paralysis and tularemia.

Wood ticks in Western Oregon, primarily Ixodes pacificus and Dermacentor occidentalis, are found most frequently from January to July, although Ixodes pacificus can be collected year-round in certain areas. Colorado tick fever and tularemia organisms were isolated from these ticks in 1967 in Western Oregon.

BASIC PRECAUTIONS

The following basic and simple precautions, when in tick-infested wooded areas, will help prevent tick attachment to the body:

1. Check for ticks on clothing and body frequently.
2. Wear clothing of tightly-woven material and wear boots.
3. Tuck trousers into boots and shirts into trousers.
4. Tick repellents containing diethyl toluamid or benz benzoate may be used on exposed body surfaces and on clothing.

CARE WHEN BITTEN

In the event that a tick does become attached to the body see a physician for removal or observe the following procedure:

1. Grasp the tick with tweezers and exert a steady gentle pull. The application of a petroleum product may aid in its removal. Care must be taken to remove the entire hypostome or mouthparts.
2. Apply an antiseptic to the site of the bite or cleanse the area thoroughly with soap and water.
3. Avoid crushing the tick since infectious organisms may be present in the tick's body fluid.
4. If you are unable to remove the tick completely, see a physician.

Work Smarter - Not Harder

IS THERE ENOUGH RADIATION FROM COLOR TV to be harmful?

We're not an expert on this subject, but checked with our extension safety specialist. The U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare says the level of radiation is quite low. They recommend that you view TV from a distance of 6 to 10 feet and avoid prolonged exposure of the body close to the back or side area of the set.

Be sure to have your set serviced only by an authorized repairman who has adequate equipment to check it. You should know, too, that there is a shield in the set to prevent radiation from leaving the cabinet.

And so it is, for those who have the habit of putting off jobs they don't like. Once you get started, you may find some of these jobs, like mending and floor cleaning, don't take so long after all.

And speaking of proverbs, that reminds us of another one, "A job begun is a job half done."

THRIFTY FOOD SHOPPERS are asking, "What size eggs are the best buy?"

Marie Tribble, Oregon State university nutritionist, suggests a simple rule to follow. If there's less than seven cents difference in cost between one size eggs and the next size smaller, the larger size will give you more for your money.

YOUNG HOMEMAKERS, if you've sprinkled clothes for ironing, be sure to finish the job in a few hours, especially when weather is warm. If left overnight, mildew is likely to result.

If only lightly mildewed, laundering may remove the stain. Otherwise, use diluted chlorine bleach on white fabrics and put in the sun to dry. For colored garments, use a light duty powdered bleach.

One way to prevent mildew is to keep dampened clothes in a cool place such as the refrigerator or freezer--if you can spare the space.

TRY THIS TIME SAVER when you're polishing furniture. Slip on a pair of soft quilted oven mitts and put oil or wax on one mitt and swipe over the furniture. Then with the other mitt, quickly shine the surface. Mitts can be washed.

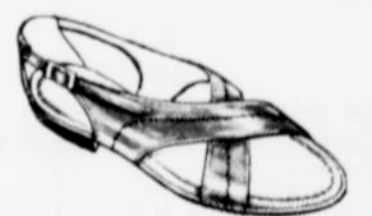
