Voter Pamphlets For May Primary In Mail By May 13

Secretary of State Clay Myers announced Friday that printing of the Voters' Pamphlet for the May 28 primary election has been started by the contractor, The Daily Journal of Commerce, Portland.

Myers said plans call for the pamphlets to be printed and delivered to the Portland Mailing Bureau by May 8.

First To Eastern Oregon

First mailings will be made to eastern Oregon counties, followed by mailings to southern Oregon and the coastal counties. All Voters' Pamphlets will be in the mail by May 13.

Myers noted the pamphlets will be unusually large this year. The Multnomah County Democratic pamphlet, for example will run to 184 pages.

Printing estimates made in January have had to be revised upwards, Myers said, because of the large number of new voters who have registered in recent weeks.

100,000 Re-Register

Myers predicted that by registration deadline on April 27, there will have been 100,000 new registrations since January 1, bringing the total number of electors eligible to vote in the primary election to over 983,000.

WORK SMARTER - NOT HARDER

A CHILD SICK IN BED can feel forgotten unless you devise an easy way for him to feel you are near.

Mrs. Roberta Frasier, Oregon State University Extension family life specialist, suggests a small bell beside the bed,

which he can ring, makes a good call device. For little children, try a pot cover and spoon or a tin can and stick. If the sick-room is upstairs, give the patient a can or stick for tapping on the floor.

If the child is well enough to sit up and play, use an ironing board as a substitute for a bed table. Turn the narrow end of the board so it projects across part of the bed to serve as a play table.
