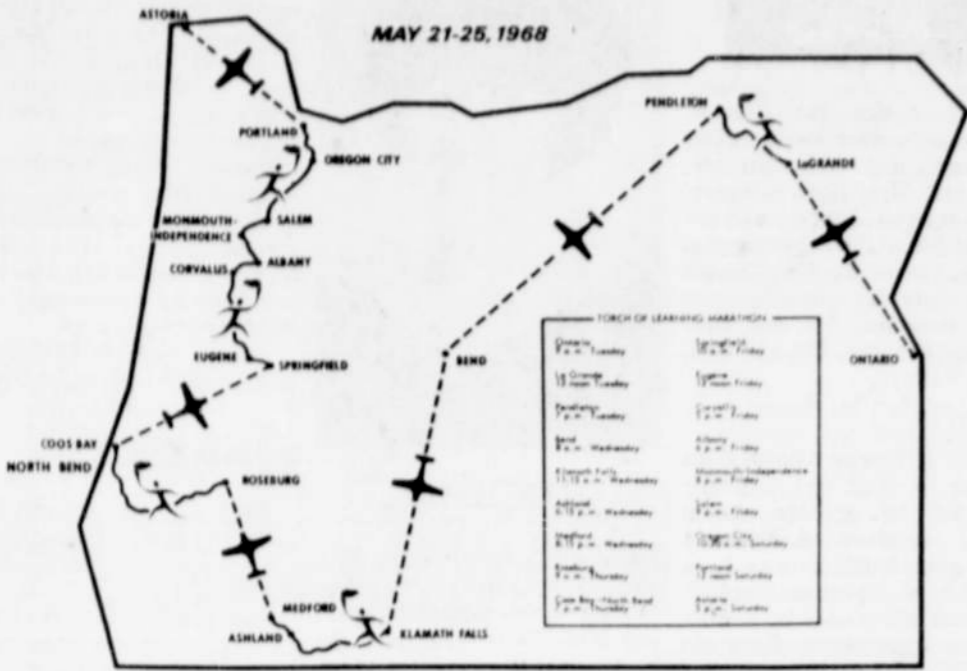


TORCH OF LEARNING MARATHON



\$13,000 Street Levy Up To Nyssa Voters In May 28 Election

Nyssa electors will vote on a proposed special tax levy to raise \$13,000 annually for a five year period May 28, as a part of the statewide primary election.

This is not a part of the proposed budget for the city but is outside the six percent limitation as provided for in the State constitution. It is limited to a maximum rate of \$1.13 per thousand dollars of true cash value on all taxable property within the city.

This is not a new program but a continuation of one approved by city electors five years ago. The funds are used for financing the cost of cleaning, repairing and maintaining streets and alleys throughout the city and the purchase, replacement, repair and maintenance of equipment used in said connection.

A Torch of Learning marathon, extending the entire length and breadth of the state of Oregon, will dramatize student concern for up-to-date facilities at Oregon's public colleges and universities.

The five day event will begin Tuesday morning, May 21, at Ontario, home of Treasure Valley Community college, and will conclude late Saturday afternoon, May 25, at Astoria, site of Clatsop Community college. Coordinator at TVCC is Otis Murray.

The torch will be lighted during a rally in downtown Ontario at 9 a.m. Tuesday, and runners will carry the burning symbol to the local airport for the flight to La Grande.

In the course of the 1,177 mile marathon, the "Torch of Learning" will be carried to every Oregon city where a college, university, or community college is located. From eastern Oregon, the route will progress through central Oregon, as far south as Ashland, north to Roseburg, west to Coos Bay back to the Willamette Valley and north to Portland, then the final leg to Astoria.

Purpose of the Torch of Learning Marathon is to call attention to the urgent need for

college classrooms, laboratory and library buildings. Ballot Measure No. 3 on the state primary election May 28 will provide funds through bonding for construction of these facilities.

The marathon will take the form of a gigantic relay race, with each runner to cover a mile carrying a torch to be passed on to the next runner. Where the distance between the college cities is more than 100 miles, an airplane will carry the torch (though the flame will be extinguished.)

Dr. Don S. Bryant, dean of special services at Oregon Technical Institute, is marathon coordinator.

For the most part, runners will be students at the various public colleges, universities and community colleges, although members of local jogging clubs and other interested persons are welcome to take part, Bryant said.
