NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, will be held as part of the statewide primary election on the 28th day of May, 1968, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and 8:00 o'clock P.M., for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said City the following question:

FIVE YEAR CONTINUING TAX LEVY FOR STREET IMPROVEMENT AND MAINTENANCE

"Shall the City Council of the City of Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, levy a special tax of \$13,000 annually, for the fiscal years 1968/1969, 1969/1970, 1970/1971, 1971/1972 and 1972/1973, outside the limitations imposed by Article XI, Section 11, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, at the maximum rate of \$1.13 per thousand dollars of true cash value upon all taxable property within said City, for the purposes of financing the cost of cleaning, repairing and maintaining the streets and alleys throughout said City and the purchase, replacement, repair and maintenance of equipment used in said connection."

The vote shall be by ballot, upon which shall be the words, "500 For Tax Levy -- Yes" and "501 For Tax Levy -- No" and the voter shall place a cross (x) between the words "500 For Tax Levy" and the word "Yes" or between the words "501 For Tax Levy" and the word "No", whichever indicates his choice.

The City and County precincts within the City of Nyssa will have uniform boundaries and the same election boards. The polling places in the City for the special tax election will be at the same places as provided by Malheur County for the statewide regular primary election, to be held on the same day, May 28, 1968, and to such places as the election boards may legally adjourn.

The City Council has appointed the identical officers appointed by the County Court of Malheur County, Oregon, for the statewide regular primary election, as the judges and clerks of the special tax election to serve in each of the polling places in the respective precincts to which they are appointed by the County Court of Malheur County.

Beet Workers' Wage Rates Set

Mr. J. P. Bunch, Chairman of the Malheur ASC County Committee, announced today the wage rates and requirements for sugarbeet work performed on or after May 20, 1968. The rates were determined by the Secretary of Agriculture following public hearings in the sugarbeet producing areas. The general provisions are the same as in the previous regulation.

Eligibility for a Sugar Act payment depends upon the producer's compliance with these wage rates and requirements. The Chairman explained that workers employed on a time basis must be paid not less than \$1.50 per hour for each of the hand labor operations of trimming, hoeing, hoe trimming, weeding, pulling, topping, or gleaning. Special wage and hour provisions cover the employment of workers 14 and 15 years old.

When employment for hand labor operations is on a piecework basis, the following minimum rates per acre apply: Trimming \$12.00; Hoeing \$14.50; Hoe Trimming \$17.50; and Weeding (Following trimming, hoeing or hoe trimming) \$9.00. The piecework rate for Blocking and Thinning, Weeding (which does not follow hand
