NYSSA INSTRUCTORS ATTEND MEXICAN CULTURE WORKSHOP

Verne Shell and Dale Schraufnagel are among Oregon's thirty participants in a Mexican culture workshop to be conducted June 18-August 4 in Marelia, Mexico.

Sponsored by Eastern Oregon college at La Grande and the Oregon State Department of Education, the seven-week workshop is designed to provide an insight into Mexican culture as well as a study in the development of materials suited for use with Mexican-Americans in the American public school classroom.

Participants receive prepaid tuition, a stipend for living expenses and a paid round-trip jet flight from Portland to Guadalajara.

Shell, a native of Wallowa, was graduated from EOC in 1947 with a degree in elementary education. He returned to Wallowa where he instructed the fifth grade for three years. He then moved to West Glacier, Mont., where he served as principal and instructor during the next two years.

In 1962 Shell attended graduate school at Montana State university and majored in elementary guidance, with a minor in speech pathology.

Moving to Nyssa in 1963, he has taught the fifth grade for four years, as well as serving as remedial and speech instructor.

Nyssa's other participant, Schraufnagel attended Lewiston, Idaho schools and graduated from Lewiston high school.

While attending the University of Idaho at Moscow, he decided to major in business and minor in English. He received a Bachelor's Degree in business education in June, 1965.

In the fall of that year Schraufnagel began his teaching career at Nyssa high school where he has instructed typing and journalism for the past

three years. His interest in various cultures was aroused by his deceased wife, the late Jeane Murillo Schraufnagel. After their marriage in May 1966, the couple traveled through Mexico, Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua and then to Sarchi, Costa Rica for a seven-week visit with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Evencio Murillo.

The Nyssa instructors' address while attending the workshop will be Instituto Cultural, Guillermo Preto #86, Morelia, Michoacan, Mexico.
