Lakeview Man Is New Judge For Slay Case

Judge Charles H. Foster of Lakeview has been assigned to preside at the second degree murder trial of Leon Evan Tobler of Nyssa. The appointment was made by William C. Perry, chief justice of the Oregon Supreme Court.

Judge Foster replaces Judge E. Otis Smith of Nyssa who had been appointed circuit judge pro tem when attorneys filed a motion requesting a new judge when Tobler said he believed Malheur County Circuit Judge Jeff D. Dorroh Jr. was prejudiced against him.

After Judge Smith's appointment, the attorneys filed a motion asking the court to disqualify Judge Smith on grounds that he was prejudiced and could not conduct a fair and impartial trial.

Tobler is accused of second degree murder in the gunshot death of his wife, Croletta, last June. Mrs. Tobler, mother of two small children died about midnight June 13 from a bullet wound in the back. Her husband was arrested shortly after her death and indicted by the Malheur County grand jury.
