Washington Gets Oregon Antelope

Twenty-one Oregon antelope found a new home in the state of Washington last week through the combined efforts of the Washington Department of Game and the Oregon Game Commission. These pronghorns will be used by the Washington department to start herds in two areas in the sagebrush flats in the eastern part of the state. The captured animals included two

yearling bucks and 19 does and fawns. John McKean, chief of game for the Commission, said that the antelope trapping was exceptionally successful. A helicopter was used to drive the animals into a wing trap that was borrowed from Idaho. They were then loaded aboard two trucks for the long haul into Washington. He said that the antelope all appeared to be in good condition. According to McKean, the mutual exchange of game birds and animals between states has been a tremendous boon to game management programs all

across the country. He said that Oregon's bighorn sheep were obtained from British Columbia, chukar partridge from Washington and Nevada, Merriams' turkeys from three southwest states, and just recently the Commission traded black-tailed deer for wild eastern turkeys from Tennessee. Mountain goats now being hunted in the Wallows originally came from northern Washington, McKean said, and it is hoped that additional goats will be obtained for transplanting into the Columbia Gorge area between Hood River

and Troutdale. McKean reported that following the antelope trapping Commission personnel made another successful drive for bighorn sheep at Hart Mountain and drove four more animals into the trap for transplanting on the Sheldon Refuge in northern Nevada. He said that eight bighorns have now been provided the Sheldon Refuge, fulfilling this cooperative effort.
