## Johnson Says Advice Costly To Taxpayers

Lee Johnson, candidate for Attorney General, today told the Prineville Kiwanis that the incumbent Attorney General's inept advice to the State Board of Pharmacy may cost Oregon taxpayers millions of dollars and countless hours of law enforcement time and energy. The Portland legislator made his remarks at the Kiwanis Club's noon luncheon.

Johnson said, "Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton yesterday tried to cover up the colossal blunder of his office in advising the State Board of Pharmacy the wrong procedures for declaring drugs like LSD illegal. Thornton... did not recollect the State Board of Pharmacy asking him for advice." Thornton's office was contacted on several occasions by executive officials and members of the Board of Pharmacy seeking advice concerning the proper procedure.

"Thornton's office advised the State Board of Pharmacy on a procedure which is illegal. Because of Thornton's advice, the Board of Pharmacy's declaration regarding LSD and other drugs was illegal and void. The result is that not only six drug abusers in Josephine County go free but every past conviction for drug abuse under the Dangerous Drug Act is questioned. Millions of dollars and untold amounts of police and prosecutors' time and energies have been devoted in trying to curb drug abuse in Oregon. It is unfortunate that all this effort has been dissipated because of the incompetence and ineptness of the Attorney General's office."
