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Richard Nixon Plans Sept. 24 Visit To Boise

Gene Stunz, Malheur County chairman of United Citizens for Nixon-Agnew, presided at an organizational meeting Monday at the Moore Hotel. He announced the appointment of Mrs. Joe Hobson of Ontario, as women's activities chairman; Dellin Erickson of Ontario, finance chairman; and Dirick Nedry of Nyssa, publicity chairman.

Stunz invited Malheur county residents to attend the rally for Richard Nixon when he appears in Boise Tuesday, September 24. Bill Campbell, Boise chairman of the Nixon committee, said that tentative plans call for a rally on the steps of the Idaho capitol building at 2:30 p.m. The Tijuana Grass band from Ontario will present some musical numbers, the Basque Dancers will perform and an address will be given by the Republican presidential candidate.

High schools in Boise will release students to see Richard Nixon, as will Boise State College, and a large crowd is expected. In case of inclement weather the ceremonies will be moved to the Boise State college gymnasium.
