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**FLAG DAYS!**

At one time or another we've all heard or voiced complaints about the meager display of Old Glory on national holidays. More often than not the outcry is justified. Many folks are just too darned lazy to raise the Stars and Stripes. Others take advantage of the holiday to travel away from home and fear they will not return until after dark and in time to lower the flag.

Many businesses are closed on legal holidays and it is an inconvenience for the proprietor to go down to the place of business to put up the flag in the morning and then return to lower it in the evening.

Down in Salem, Arkansas, the Jaycees have come up with a wonderful solution to the problem -- a solution so simple and logical that it has added a great deal to the community's business district and to the Jaycees' own image as community leaders.

The Salem Jaycees furnish a flag to any business that requests one. The members put up the flag on holidays, take them down in the evening, and store them until the next holiday. The only exception is in the case of inclement weather. The Jaycee program includes 16 holidays a year; the total cost is a mere \$10 per year per flag.

The project reached its high point on Labor Day, when 48 flags were raised over Salem. Since then, six more businesses have requested the service.

Now the Jaycees have undertaken to offer the same service to homeowners. They've set a goal of 75 flags for Thanksgiving Day.

Can you imagine the impression the casual traveler got when he drove through Salem on Labor Day?

But never mind the out-of-towner. Imagine the pride of the businessmen in Salem.

**A TRAIN IN YOUR LIFE**

The impact of rail transport on your daily life is profound and constant. The family automobile, the lumber for your home, the rugs, the drapes, the furniture, the stove, the refrigerator, and the food on the dining room table, in their journey, from point of production to your town, very likely came by rail. So it is with good reason that the United States' railroads are called the backbone of the nation's transport system. No other means of transport has the built-in efficiency and sheer hauling capacity to move the vast output of the most productive people on earth and keep the supply lines of this far-flung nation of more than 200 million people flowing.

An advertisement in Railway Age makes the point of railroad hauling power and efficiency very clear. It explains that at one time it took 1,800 drivers to get 1,800 cars out of Detroit. If one car towed another with a bumper hitch, man power was cut to 900 drivers and trailer trucks could cut it to 300 drivers. But, when the railroads got into the picture with specially designed and built, multi-decked, automobile-hauling freight cars, the picture changed. Then one driver -- the engineer at the head of the train -- could move 1,800 or 2,000 cars at one time.

Nothing moves as easily as steel wheels rolling on a steel rail. Add to this the multi-billion dollar railway modernization program that is bringing even greater economies to every phase of railroad operation from roadbed maintenance to billing procedures, and the reason for the dominant position of rail transport in the nation's distribution system becomes quite apparent. Although the average person may not ride a passenger train or see a 100-car freight train snaking swiftly across the country, the iron horse is an ever-present factor in our lives -- it hauls our standard of living to us - (Industrial News Review).

It's a capital idea, and there isn't any patent on it. We hope it will be copied by Jaycees, or equally enterprising organizations in cities and towns across the country, and continue for so long as Old Glory flies.
