AMIGO

Yellow Sweet Spanish hybrid, highly selected onion. Vigorous uniform high globe with resistance to "Oregon strain" pink root. Very free from doubles. The skin, an attractive medium yellow will adhere well in handling and storage. The flesh is fairly firm and mild.

EL DIABLO

A vigorous uniform high globe Yellow Sweet Spanish Hybrid. Very similar to Amigo but slightly later in maturity, and has a larger neck. Handles and stores much the same as Amigo.

MONARCH

A very highly productive uniform Yellow Sweet Spanish. Scales are light yellow to golden yellow in color. Adheres well in handling and storage. High globe with excellent resistance to Oregon strain Pink Root. Flesh is fairly firm and very mild. Highly selected for "single centeredness".

PECKHAM HYBRID

Yellow Sweet Spanish Hybrid. Highly productive, very uniform, long storage type. Very attractive yellow bronze scales that adhere well in handling and storage. Highly selected for "single centeredness". Adapted for French Fried Processors. Flesh fairly firm and mild.

VICTORY

Highly selected Yellow Sweet Spanish onion. A vigorous, uniform globe to high globe of long storage type. Very attractive golden bronze scales that adhere well in mechanical handling and storage. Flesh is firm and fairly mild.

OPEN POLLINATED
RINGMASTER

Selected Utah White Sweet Spanish, pink root resistant, single centered, making it especially desirable for processing of onion rings. Dry skin is a very white color and adheres well in handling and storage. Good keeper and the flesh is fairly firm and very mild.

YELLOW SWEET SPANISH "Winegar"

Highly selected vigorous globe to high globe, dark yellow scale and adheres well in handling and storage. Selected for greater depth and less doubling. Flesh is fairly firm and mild.

YELLOW SWEET SPANISH "Utah"

Medium maturing high globe with dark yellow scales. Selected toward non-doubling. The flesh is firm and mild.

YELLOW SWEET SPANISH "Peckham"

Highly productive, long storage Spanish. Very attractive bronze scale which is tough and adheres very well in handling and storage. Well adapted to mechanical harvesting. The flesh is firm and somewhat pungent.

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
