

### IDAHO POWER HEATS 5,000 SRV HOMES

Idaho Power Company reported recently that the number of new and converted electric-heat homes in the Snake River valley has reached the 5,000 mark, calling it a "significant milestone in the area's steady progress toward an ever-higher standard of electric living."

D. S. Bailey, vice-president for division operations, announced the milestone in a report also showing that more than half of all the new homes completed in southern Idaho and eastern Oregon during the first nine months of 1968 were electrically heated.

Bailey said the new mark was reached with a home converted to electric heat by Dr. L. H. Mason, Boise.

The utility executive presented Mason and his wife with an award designating their residence (at 4020 Hillcrest Drive) as the 5,000th electric-heat on Idaho Power's lines.
