

NHS Hoopsters Bow To Vallivue, Kelly

Two defeats were on tap last week for the Nyssa varsity hoopsters, as in SRV A-1 play on Friday evening they lost by four points, 40-36, to the Vallivue Falcons. The following evening was different story, scorewise, as they fell to the Bishop Kelly lads by an 84-36 final tally.

The Friday evening win was the first league competition for the Vallivue cagers who at that time held a 1-2 conference record. Overall they were 2-6.

Falcon Doug Fleming led the scoring with 14 points, while Craig Lewis and Jim Beck topped the Nyssa scorers with 10 each.

Other Bulldog counters were tossed through the hoops by Rick Wilson, 7; Larry Wilson, 6; and John Shell, 3.

During the Saturday evening contest, Jerry Heckley of the Kelly squad racked up 21 points to capture the top-scoring spot. The Boise youths' record for the year is 9-2, while the NHS Bulldogs have lost all six of their conference games, making their standing for the season, 2-7.

Kelly started slow and managed only a 22-17 lead at the end of the first period. The local lads stayed close and trailed 38-22 at halftime.

It was in the third period when the Bulldogs cooled off and the Knights poured in 22 points, limiting the Nyssa lads

to five, with a 60-27 score going into the final quarter. Other top-scoring men for the Bishop Kelly squad were Pat Williamson and Nick Ysura with 13 each and Bill Fritz with 12.

Nyssa's counters were made by L. Wilson, 8; Beck, 7; Shell, Lewis, Manley and Loera, 4 apiece; Jeffers and Elgueza-bal, 2 each; Sutschkow, 1.

Results of this week's game against Vale were not available in time for this week's issue of the Journal. The Bulldogs' next contest is Saturday evening, Jan. 25 against Burns, on the Nyssa court. Varsity game time is 8 o'clock, with the junior varsity contest to start at 6:45 p.m.

Another of my goals is the achievement of a significant reduction in the amount of partisanship and petty political backbiting which has consumed considerable time of some legislators in past sessions.

As a taxpayer, I get awfully tired of seeing some elected officials devote most of their energy and efforts to political games rather than to their official responsibilities. The job facing us is much too enormous to spend so much as a single minute engaged in political fighting.

In a statement shortly after my election as Speaker, I expressed my hopes that the new legislature will place progress above partisanship and cooperation above competition to work with a unity of purpose for the common goals important to all Oregonians.

I intend to do my best to see that this goal is realized, and I have asked other legislators to join with me in making that pledge.

I hope to be able to communicate with many of you through this column, and I extend my thanks to the editor for his allowing me this weekly forum.

However, I encourage each and every one of you to write to me in Salem with any specific questions you may have or with any opinions on the legislation we will be considering.
