\$44.8 Billion Paid For Unemployment

The total amount of Unemployment Insurance benefit payments paid in the United States during the past 30 years is \$44.8 billion. This total covers only net benefit payments made from the time they first became available through the end of June, 1968. Oregon paid its first unemployment insurance benefits in January, 1938 and since then through June 30 has paid out \$530.7 million in benefits. The average benefit check for the fiscal year ending June 30 was \$38.18 per week.
