Reservoir Fills

Focht said he was checking the situation daily and doing everything possible to keep flood damage at a minimum. Water started through the Glory Hole (the 60-foot diameter spillway reaching 384 feet straight down to the river bed) Friday. During this time water was flowing into the reservoir at about twice the rate as that being released. The amount being released was cut back from 11,000 second feet to 8,000 Tuesday by raising the stem in the Glory Hole 1.40 feet. This was made possible only because the inflow had decreased.

Two diversions from the Owyhee into the Snake, via canals, have also been used to send part of the water into Snake river, by-passing the Owyhee.

Summing it up, Focht said, "The amount of water released depends on the inflow, and the inflow is governed by the weather."
